The In School Mentoring program pairs up teen volunteers from William Morton Collegiate Institute with children from Gladstone Elementary School for one lunch hour a week for the school year. They spend the time eating, playing games and talking. Teens who participate in this program are able to work towards a volunteer credit as well as receive a reference for future school and job applications. As of Oct. 22 we have ten teens that have expressed interest in mentoring.
